Friday Community Operations Update

This week, crews were busy making irrigation repairs, trimming trees and shrubs, mowing lawns, removing weeds and inspecting the health of plants and trees in the Desert Vista, Reflection Bay, Avalon Del Lago, Overlook, Cielo, Trailridge Crossing, Avalon Terrace, Privada and Eagle Point neighborhoods, as well as along the San Miguel Right-of-Way.

Crews continue to inspect the community for storm damage; they are removing fallen trees and restaking ones that are leaning. Additionally, spray techs are applying pre-emergent on San Gabriel Road; they will be working in the neighborhoods of **Sonoran Vistas** and **Mesquite Ridge** next week.

The More You Know: Hiking and Heat Safety

Estrella's 50+ miles of hiking trails, coupled with the amazing hiking trails throughout the state of Arizona, are a wonderful way to spend time outdoors. With temperatures higher than ever and monsoon season upon us, it's important to keep these hiking safety tips in mind...



Watch the weather: A dry heat is still heat. Hike early in the morning and in the early evenings when there is more shade. Note the temperature when you leave and understand

that it may be 15-20 degrees hotter in the sun on the trail.

Dress appropriately: Wear comfortable shoes, lightweight clothing that is breathable and moisture-wicking, a hat and sunscreen.

Bring water: Hydrate before you go and bring more water than you think you will need. If only half of your water is left, it's time to turn back and head to the trailhead.

Food = Fuel: Take a break and eat before you are hungry to replace electrolytes that you are sweating out. Salty snacks like mixed nuts or trail mix, dried fruit, granola bars, apples and oranges are convenient and pack up nicely. Taking periodic breaks -- five to seven minutes for every 30-60 minutes -- is a good idea to rest the body and take in the scenery.

Stay in touch: If you are hiking alone, let family members or friends know where you are going and when you expect to return. Carry your phone with you on the trail.

Be honest: If you have medical issues such as asthma, or heart, knee or back problems, don't push yourself. Move at a comfortable pace and use hiking sticks to alleviate pressure on your legs and to keep steady on rocky trails.

Don't trailblaze: Stay on designated trails to avoid injury or unplanned meet-ups with cacti or desert wildlife, snakes or insects.
